

Graduating Student Survey: 2015 – 2016 Academic Year

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Overview

The Graduating Student Survey was designed to gather opinions of graduating students related to various components of the educational experience at the University of South Alabama and their post-graduation plans. The Graduate Student Survey was conducted electronically using the Class Climate survey system. It included Likert scale, multiple choice, and open-ended questions. The survey was left open the last four weeks of each semester. Participation was voluntary and reminder emails were sent every five days before the close of the survey.

Sample

The sample consisted of students who graduated in Fall 2015, Spring 2016, and Summer 2016. The final sample of graduating students consisted of 3,698 students, 1,833 participants completed the survey for a response rate of 49.6% Respondent demographics are displayed in the following tables (n = number of respondents).
