Alabama History

We are Here: African American History and Historical Sites on the Eastern Shore of Mobile Bay Alabama

We are Here is a digital initiative supported by the National Endowment for the Humanities, the Alabama Humanities Alliance, and the University of South Alabama.

In the first wave of the project, our team gathered oral histories in Fairhope and Point Clear related to African American historical sites listed in the state and national registers. The oral histories also documented sites that have not yet been listed but which are, or *may be*, eligible for the registers. The webpage linked above focuses on one of these sites: the Anna T. Jeanes School located in an unincorporated area of Baldwin County between Fairhope and Point Clear.

The second phase of this project, January 2025-December 2025, will gather additional oral histories between Daphne and Fairhope, and will create a digital tour of African American Historical landmarks along the Eastern Shore.

Russian and Eastern European History

My career began (and continues) with research in Russian and Eastern European History; most of my publications are in that area. To date, I have published 4 books, 2 of which are co-edited volumes; more than 20 articles; contributed to multiple television and newspaper accounts of the annexation of Crimea, and war in Ukraine; and delivered nearly 50 conference presentations and invited lectures.

Embedded with my long term focus on religious nationalism and war, my research has examined Russian state-sponsored historic preservation efforts and programs in contested spaces, particularly Crimea. Books with a Historic Preservation theme are indicated below:
